(i) INTRODUCTION

PURPOSE

Education, Arts, Sports and Youth are integral to the development of the shire and its occupants.

METHODOLOGY

The Banana Shire Council has identified that a "Place Based Plan" is required in each of the Shire's twelve towns. This will allow us to develop a positive trend regarding population growth as well as fulfilling the potential of the individual community's economic and social future.

From the development of the "Place Based" plans the Banana Shire Strategic Community Plan will be developed.

- Community Engagement processes with residents in the Shire
- Related Internet Search



LOCATION

Biloela is a rural service centre located in central eastern Queensland's Callide Valley at the junction of the Burnett and Dawson Highways 594 km North-West of Brisbane, 145km South-West of Rockhampton 127 km from Gladstone. It sits 173 metres above sealevel.

HISTORY

The Gaangulu tribe, who inhabited the region prior to European settlement, named the area Biloela after their totem: the white cockatoo. The town was gazetted in 1924 and the railway arrived the following year. Government assistance continued with the opening of a Primary School.

The primary infrastructure of the town was developed between 1930 and 1941. This ranged from the School of Arts to many of the local churches, the courthouse, hospital and local newspaper. In 1946 the Council Offices were transferred to Biloela from Wowan and by 1952 numerous retailers had opened stores as the meatworks had commenced operation. By 1965 the Callide Dam was completed creating an assured water supply for the area. Since then the town has continued to grow increasing its population significantly.

DESCRIPTION

Biloela is located approximately 594km northwest of Brisbane. It is the administrative centre of the Banana Shire. Today Biloela is a modern town characterised by wellestablished businesses and a thriving service industry which caters for not only Biloela but other towns in the region.

It continues to have a strong working relationship with Gladstone and Rockhampton. Due to its location at the intersection of the Dawson and Burnett

Highways, the town is well supplied with accommodation and eating facilities.

Biloela's economy is extremely diverse and is driven by many different areas of industry. The area around the township has a very healthy agricultural base with a wide variety of crops grown. It is also home to a very successful beef and intensive livestock producing industry.

The beef production supports Teys Australia Meatworks which employs many residents in the community. CS Energy and the Batchfire Callide Mine are major industries which drive growth in Biloela and the surrounding area.

Batchfire Callide is a major Queensland coal mining operation with a production capacity of around 13 million tonnes a year and has supported the Biloela economy for 70 years.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF KEY CENSUS RESULTS

In the 2011 Census, there were 5885 persons usually resident in the town of Biloela. It is estimated that 1153 persons reside in the immediate environs. 51% were males and 49% were females. Of the total population in Biloela 4% were Indigenous persons, compared with 2.5% Indigenous persons in Australia.

COMMUNITY IDENTITY & VISION

VISION FOR BILOELA

The vision for Biloela is to grow to 10,000 people by 2040. This will be achieved through:

- leadership supporting the growth and development of business and industry across the Banana Shire
- building on the lifestyle opportunities through amenity and infrastructure development
- attracting and retaining government services through building collaborative partnerships
- ensuring that the lifestyle of the residents is foremost in our planning
- ensuring that Biloela is recognised as a regional centre by all levels of government thereby attracting investment

COMMUNITY PLAN

GOVERNMENT SERVICES-HEALTH, EDUCATION & GOVERNMENT AGENCIES

Due to the vision to reach a population of 10,000 in the next 30 years, ensuring efficient, practical government services is of the utmost importance.

HEALTH

The following issues identified by residents need to be addressed as they will limit the growth and sustainability of Biloela and the Banana Shire:

 The implementation of Biloela as a hub for the surrounding area by Queensland

- Health will assist in ensuring that specialist services are available in the area
- The availability of adequate numbers of General Practitioners and Allied Health personnel to cater for the needs of the area has been identified as an issue.
 Supporting the implementation of current Primary Health Care solutions is imperative for the attraction and retention of medical personnel to the area
- Ensuring the availability of continuing medical services working with children such as Child Psychologists and Therapists
- Continue to support the Community Resource Centre in delivering resources and services to the community
- The lack of Drug and Alcohol Abuse Education and Prevention, and Suicide Prevention services

It is recommended that reviews of the health & welfare services required for meeting the ever-changing needs of Biloela and surrounding areas are undertaken on a regular basis.

EDUCATION SERVICES

For Biloela to grow and thrive access to quality education services is imperative. Parents want their children to receive a high-quality education and this can influence families to relocate to larger towns especially when secondary school requirements are being considered, so it is of great importance that a wide range of subjects and opportunities are available.

Student safety is a concern for the community and as a result it would be worthwhile taking steps to ensure local road conditions such as speed limits, bus zones, parking and signage is appropriate.

There are a variety of groups in the community that would benefit from

improvements to educational services and support.

- Adult Literacy Programs
- Mature Age Learning opportunities
- Defensive Driver Training opportunities
- Suicide Prevention Program
- Drug and Alcohol Abuse Education and Prevention Program
- Migrant Services
 - Language and cultural support for people from non-english speaking backgrounds arriving in the area
 - Early intervention services for school aged children from migrant families

Other available Services:

- improve course variety at the local CQU
- promote available GAGAL (BEST Centre) training courses and services

HOUSING AND ACCOMMODATION

The introduction of a variety of housing would assist in increasing the population of Biloela as well as offering options to those already living in the area. Increase of rural residential land would encourage greater opportunities.

Considerations of more flexible housing choices to create viable options to deal with the future increase of Biloela's population are: An increase in the number of -

- · Nursing home spaces
- Supervised housing
- Independent Living Units
- Community housing

Development of suitable housing for young, single professionals is an opportunity for the developers that will assist in shaping Biloela into a community of choice for newcomers.

POLICING

Introduction of 24-hour policing as well as increasing the police interaction with the

community was requested to facilitate positive contact between the community and local police. This could include an increased school presence and "walking the beat".

The ageing infrastructure also needs attention.

GOVERNMENT OFFICES

While the government agencies in the Biloela area do an excellent job, improvements could be made in numerous areas that would not only enhance Biloela as a community now, but would also prepare the area for an increase in population.

- The opening hours of the government agency was a common theme in all discussions
- The reduction of government agencies such as the DAF services and Sun Water is also a concern

COUNCIL OPERATIONS

One of the main issues raised was the lack of information provided to the community regarding decisions.

The cost of rates in the Shire was raised as a concern. It was voiced that the discounts given to pensioners are insufficient in comparison to the increasing cost of living. Increasing the discount was seen as an opportunity for the Council to assist pensioners in the community.

YOUTH

Youth issues were also a common theme throughout the Shire and especially in Biloela. Issues raised include:

- Low understanding of the actual services that are provided to young people
- School Chaplaincy
- Drug and alcohol education
- Defensive Driving Programs
- Events for teenagers
- Health issues e.g. Suicide Prevention

 Non-sporting activities such as orienteering and youth coffee shop

Facilitating events to discuss issues and solutions for the youth would be of great benefit especially if the youth themselves and their families have the greatest say and were given the opportunity to drive the solutions.

DISABILITY SERVICES

The Community Resource Centre delivers much needed services to persons with a disability and their families. The ongoing development and maintenance of current facilities is important to the continuity of our lifestyle within the Shire. The Sailability in the Bush program is an important activity that continues to deliver opportunities. Other issues that need to be considered are:

- What happens to young people with a disability after they leave school
- Life skills development
- Learning activities
- Projects that initiate meaningful employment
- Supported employment opportunities
- Supported living accommodation program
- Extension of "Young Aussie" group
- Respite care

Disability access for all of the community needs greater consideration; for example:

- Patterned footpaths make it difficult for people with Parkinson's Disease to be able to move about
- More seating
- Better footpath networks
- Hand rails on steps and stairs
- More disability parking
- Hydro therapy pool
- All abilities water fountain play area

OLDER RESIDENTS

Services and infrastructure for our ageing population, both in the town and in the rural areas, is a concern. A plan regarding the future requirements of our elderly needs to be addressed:

Support an increase in independent living

- Increased care within retirement villages
- In home services
- Respite care and activities for the elderly on weekends

CULTURAL DIVERSITY

Biloela celebrates its cultural diversity as it has always been attractive to migrating families. During settlement migrants from Russia, Greece, Italy and Germany made Biloela district their home. Today the community welcomes migrants from many countries including Brazil, Vietnam, China and Burma.

To be able to attract and retain new residents employment must be made available. The reliance on industry has been too great and new ideas need to be established, especially in agriculture. As previously indicated language skills are imperative to ensure success for the families involved.

COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE

The infrastructure of Biloela has multiple challenges that, when addressed, will improve the community's chances of reaching the proposed population of 10,000 in the next 30 years.

Facilities such as the Civic Centre, PCYC, Magavalis Sporting Complex and the Banana Shire Regional Art Gallery all need to be upgraded and promoted. The ongoing support for the Men's Shed is a high priority in the community.

It has been suggested that a cost-effective method of promoting fitness within the community would be a commitment to continuing the current and future development of walking and cycling tracks and the provision of multiple outside gyms. This would also offer a high level of facilities to visitors and potential residents.

To improve the safety and lifestyle of those in Biloela, street lighting needs to be improved.

The establishment of an "Aquatic Centre" including disability access, water park feature as well as the provision of hydrotherapy for 12 months of the year has great support in the community.

The Magavalis Sporting Complex could be utilised and promoted for larger scale events in the area such as regional competitions and finals. The installation of outdoor exercise stations near the Magavalis Sports Complex is a potential improvement of the town's facilities.

The continued development of the Banana Shire Regional Art Gallery is important to the community. Residents expressed their belief in the importance of the Gallery as a home for Council's art collection and art, and a venue for cultural events.

Hosting festivals and events would encourage greater community connectedness and cultural understanding. Biloela has a number of excellent venues, the Heritage Park, PCYC, The Civic Centre and Lion's and Melton Parks that can be accessed for a range of activities.

PARKS AND GARDENS

Upgrades and maintenance of the current gardens as well as the addition of new gardens could be considered as they fulfil the purpose of impacting the aesthetics and feel of the area. For these gardens, the use of drought resistant plants as well as the use of recycled water could ensure the prevalence of attractive, yet manageable gardens.

There is a number of small parks scattered across Biloela that need to be assessed for usage and cost effectiveness. Suggested solutions involve the amalgamation of park land and reducing the total number of parks in the area to allow resources to be concentrated on improving a few instead of maintaining them all.

The sale of small parks to create more housing in the area could potentially fund the improvement of the remaining parks.

It was suggested a "Celebration Tree" could be planted. This would be available for use for community events. This could be included along with giant chess sets, aviaries, and botanic gardens as possible additions that would encourage interaction within the community, especially cross generational and cultural collaboration.

Being the larger parks in Biloela, the continued development of Lion's Park, Melton Park and Possum Park can be considered a priority by Council. Continued irrigation and planning would be of great benefit to the community utilising the parks.

CALLIDE STREET RAIL PRECINCT

With the closure of the railway in Biloela there are a number of possibilities for the land - high density housing, parkland, waterpark or community recreation space. The community needs to be engaged to develop plans for possible future uses of the area.

BILOELA LAWN CEMETERY

The Biloela Lawn Cemetery is an extremely important part of the parks management in the community. It is believed that the area needs to have a higher priority in the maintenance schedule as well as the following developments and upgrades:

- Outdoor chapel and gardens
- Gravesite directory
- Parking and drive way

ROADS AND TRANSPORT

Urban and rural roads require constant planning for maintenance and upgrading.

- The ongoing development of the CBD is necessary
- The current and future state of Council and Main Roads must be addressed
- The use of roads as a heavy transit route through Biloela is a concern and the development of a heavy vehicle diversion is required
- The timely maintenance of routes utilised by school buses must be undertaken
- The upgrading of the road from Gladstone to Biloela opens economic and social opportunities
- Transport issues related to accessing health care

WATER (DOMESTIC)

Conservation and sustainable use by the community, proper industry use and general auditing of water usage would improve the situation in Biloela and ensure the limited supply of water available lasts for the future.

The use of water captured in retention basins and use of recycled water for irrigation of parks is a potential solution that fits with the overall management and conservation of water.

HEALTH INFRASTRUCTURE

With the upgrading of the Biloela Hospital and the relocation of Community Health to the Hospital Complex, the pathway to continual upgrades has commenced. As Biloela develops its services as a Health Hub the hospital will need to continue to develop around the community's needs.

TOURISM

Tourism in the area has the potential to be a great boon to the community. To ensure the

constant stream of visitors to the area certain steps can be taken.

The addition of attractions and facilities to the area such as a Botanical Garden, cycling routes and facilities like bike racks would be of benefit. There would be a two-fold benefit with the attraction of tourists and a potential increase in employment opportunities.

The improvement and maintenance of various tourist attractions in the area such as Kroombit Tops National Park, Mt Scoria and the redeveloped Mine Lookout need to be undertaken.

The continued development of the Callide Dam recreational area and the attraction of a caravan park developer are critical additions to the tourism development in the shire.

There are real opportunities for the tourism industry in Biloela and the Banana Shire:

- The development of a cluster project that works with communities developing their tourism product including:
 - Camping and overnight stay providers
 - Operators of current and future attractions specifically the Qld Heritage Park, Moura Miners Memorial and the Ludwig Leichardt Centre in Taroom
 - Dawson River and Callide Dam promotional collaboration, including events, competitions and recreational pursuits
 - Provision of event management services by the Banana Shire Council to support the organisations building on their events
 - Installation of reinforcement signage, that aligns with current websites
 - Working with caravan park owners to look at the changing industry and promote themselves and Biloela as a "Hub" for exploring the region
 - o Farm & Eco Tourism

- Promotion of the Civic Centre as a destination for conferences family events and weddings
- Promote the area's history and highlight the work being done at the Qld Heritage Park by placing old machinery in specific locations around Biloela

AESTHETICS

Ensuring that the town's overall facilities are maintained is important. The overall feel of the town would improve and this would encourage more visitors to stop.

The beautification and continued improvement of town entrances should be undertaken. Town entrances such as the Thangool-Biloela entrance need continual upgrading and maintenance to ensure a good impression is made.

The growth and renewal of the town centre can be fostered through the development of strategies that encourage the renewal of the town centre streetscape.

PARKING

Lack of parking is an important consideration for both visitors and locals, especially for longer vehicles. This creates problems as many visitors have caravans.

Potential parking areas are the unused land owned by Qld Rail at the centre of town.

SKATE PARK

After hosting a discussion with the youth currently utilising the Biloela Skate Park, the following information was gathered about what they would like to see done to their area in the future. Current usage of the facilities sees an average attendance of 30 to 40 people on a weekday afternoon and 60 or more people on weekends. People from outside of the Banana Shire also utilise the park at times.

Requests came in two essential forms; facilities requests and upgrade/equipment requests. The creation of a family friendly area around the skate park would include the installation of:

- Rubbish bins
- Toilets
- Seating area
- Shade structures
- BBQ
- Trees
- Irrigation system to keep the grass green and appealing

The remainder of the requests where for additions to the park itself:

- Extend the Skate Park
- More ramps
- Steel half pipe
- Table tops in extension
- Enclosed bowl with spine
- Foam pit (indoor)
- Stairs set
- Vert wall and mega ramp
- Removal of middle rail
- Roll in
- Dirt jumps/track adjacent to park
- Longer flat rail
- Pyramid/lip
- Manual pad
- "Boob" small hill
- Shade over the skate area

Other requests were that repairs be undertaken to remove cracks in the park and cleaning up of the surfaces.

SHOPPING LOCALLY

Biloela retailers will always need to be aware of the competition that comes from Rockhampton and Gladstone. The perceived price difference between the larger urban areas and Biloela and Banana Shire will always be an issue. It is important to encourage the use of local shopping by residents as opposed to travelling outside the Shire. However, certain actions can be undertaken to mitigate any impact.

The Callide Dawson Chamber of Commerce is driving the development of the business sector within Biloela by implementing:

- A review into what businesses and services Biloela is lacking and the viability of attracting them to town
- That all business development includes consideration for the towns of Thangool, Jambin, Goovigen
- A review of business and development opportunities and promote and implement

NICHE BUSINESSES

An important economic driver is the unique niche businesses in the Shire encouraging the development of niche industries greatly benefit would the commercial viability of the area and ensure population growth.

There are many examples within the Shire, including the Squab Industry supplying Sydney and Melbourne, the Herb industry supplying Gourmet Garden, Native Tree Seeds exporting to the world and grain and seed being exported internationally to strong markets.

It is acknowledged that there is potential for the development of the export of many of the Shire's products and commodities.

While Council recognises the need to expand the product base of the Shire and advocates for the development, it is also aware that these developments must be commercially driven.

BUSINESS RELATIONSHIPS

The relationship between industry, agriculture and the mines within the Banana Shire is of the utmost importance. By cultivating good relationships between these groups, we can ensure that activities undertaken within Biloela benefit the area. Part of this is the potential for greater assimilation of new employees from major industries into the community.

RURAL FUTURE

Due to the location and industry of Biloela, it is understandable that the "rural future" of the area is of utmost importance to the community.

Key issues are:

- Retention and use of prime agricultural land for farming
- Availability and security of water
- Access to Research, Development and Extension.
- The condition of rural roads
- Commercial access for transporting commodities

WATER (COMMERCIAL)

Water and the quality of water impacts Biloela and local industry. Farming (underground aquifers and irrigation) and future upgrades to Teys Australia Meatworks is dependent on the availability of water. It is also important that:

- Greater water storage and management methods are developed to ensure our industries are protected
- The construction of the Nathan Dam is considered; as doing so will result in the increased total amount of water available in the area
- The raising of existing barrages in the Dawson such as Glebe, Taroom, Theodore, Baralaba and Moura would benefit these communities through an increase in available water
- It is acknowledged that water is critical for expansion in the Banana Shire
- The management of water and the Callide Dam by Sunwater is critical to Socio Economics and safety of the community

ENVIRONMENT

The environmental and cumulative impacts on the area from industry growth were raised as a concern. Also, Council's Weed and Pest Management Plan and the Environmental Management Plan were raised as positive

outcomes for Council and the knowledge that Council is committed to their continual review.

ECONOMIC STRATEGY

To protect Biloela as a hub of commerce and industry Banana Shire Council and the business, industry and tourism sectors need to come together to create and implement an Economic Development Strategy.

COMMUNITY PLANNING ENGAGEMENT AND FUTURE PLANNING

The ongoing process of updating and ensuring that the community owns the community plan will be undertaken following the timeline below.
