(i) Introduction

PURPOSE

Also, this plan aims to develop a long term strategy for the growth and development of the Banana Shire. This growth and development will be considered in a wide range of areas that are mentioned in this document. These areas such as Arts, Sports and Youth are considered to be integral to the development of the shire and its occupants.

METHODOLOGY

The Banana Shire Council has identified that a "Place Based" Plan is required in each of the Shire's twelve towns. This will allow us to develop a positive trend regarding population growth as well as fulfilling the potential of the individual community's economic and social future.

From the development of the "Place Based" plans, the Banana Shire Strategic Community Plan will be developed.

In summation, the consultation process will include:

- Gathering of and referral to available ABS statistics;
- Discussion of related issues and policy with Government Departments and key stakeholder representatives;
- Meetings with representatives from regional organisations that have economic development roles:
- Attendance at meetings, networking or speaking to local leaders and community groups;

- Research/referral to a variety of regional strategic

- planning/consultancies currently in progress;
- Community Engagement processes with residents in the Shire:
- Related Internet Search.



LOCATION

Taroom is located 198 kilometres southwest from Biloela and 466 kilometres northwest from Brisbane.

HISTORY

In 1844, Prussian born explorer and scientist Ludwig Leichhardt and his party of eight set out on a journey from Jimbour Station on the Darling Downs to Port Essington on the Northern Territory coast. During the 14-month trek, Leichhardt passed through what is now the Taroom area. In travelling between Wandoan and Taroom and areas to the north, the explorers had to become proficient at battling through dense scrub and conquering hills, gullies and steep gorges.

Leichhardt crossed the nearby river, naming it the Dawson and moved on to Lake Murphy. He then headed north-west, passing what is now Expedition National Park.

Early settlers came from the New England and Hunter River areas of New South Wales. They took up land in 1845, only one year after the explorer Leichhardt travelled through on his epic journey north.

At first, the settlers tried to graze sheep, but soon cattle grazing became the main industry. Grain growing and timber became important as well.

DESCRIPTION

Nestled on the Dawson River, Taroom is richly endowed with natural attractions, a thriving rural sector and a wide range of quality community and business facilities. Natural attractions in the area include the Isla Gorge, the Precipice and the Expedition National Parks. These destinations showcase spectacular eroded sandstone areas.

The Glebe Weir, located in the area, is a popular boating, fishing and camping spot.

The name Taroom is believed to be an aboriginal name meaning pomegranate or lime tree. A Coolabah tree in the main street is branded with the letters LL – scored in the

bark by explorer Ludwig Leichhardt in 1844 on his overland trek from Dalby to Port Essington. A large sandstone monument stands in the park beside the Council Chambers.

Taroom has a rare "steel wings" windmill of unusual design, being one of only six models ever erected. Along with a windmill in Jerilderie in the Riverina, the fully restored windmills are the only two known working examples in the world. They are designed so their fan is contained and spins within the fully pivoting frame.

Executive Summary of Key Census Results

In the 2011 Census, there were 873 people in Taroom district, of these 48.7% were male and 51.3% were female. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people made up 2.6% of the population compared with 2.3% indigenous persons in Australia. Taroom has a population of approximately 630 people within the town.

COMMUNITY IDENTITY & VISION

Taroom is striving to be a community that is continually achieving. It is a community that provides services to thriving grazing, farming and resource industries. Taroom residents are focused on the protection and growth of their grazing and agricultural land and recognize the benefits of attracting service industries to town as well as identifying with the opportunities to build on tourism.

Taroom is a supportive residential community that encourages the promotion of their town and district.

COMMUNITY PLAN

The community sees the following projects as part of achieving its community identity:

- The Leichhardt Centre
- Continued improvement within the town, including channelling and kerbing, parks and sporting facilities
- National Parks managed and developed to attract more visitors
- Sealing of the Fitzroy development road
- Youth centre/youth activities
- Youth worker
- Improve linkages with the rest of the Shire in mail services
- Improve access to media services
- Develop sporting opportunities with a focus on encouraging youth participation
- Develop a Childcare Centre

It should be ensured that all projects are planned with view to long term viability.

Tourism

The Taroom community has a fantastic opportunity to benefit from tourism in the area as there is a high volume of caravaners that regularly pass through the town. By embracing this industry, Taroom has the opportunity for growth. The reestablishment of the Caravan Park or camping at the showground or race course is critical to encourage overnight stays.

Taroom has two excellent motels that offer travellers wonderful service.

Attractions

Prime tourist attractions in the area are the path of Ludwig Leichhardt and the local National Parks. By promoting these as attractions, as well as ensuring their maintenance and development, Taroom would be able to draw more tourists to the area and ensure they stay longer. However, these areas need work. The road access to the National Parks is unsuitable for many vehicles, restricting the potential number of visitors to the area.

The development and construction of a **Ludwig Leichhardt Centre** would serve to attract visitors to the area. It would also celebrate the town's part in the history of the

surrounding regions, assisting in maintaining the heritage and historical values of Taroom and district.

Other options for encouraging tourism in the area include the development of water based recreational activities including:

- Boat ramp adjacent to the old bridge in Taroom
- Amenities at Glebe Weir
- Improving signage for Isla Gorge and Martins Range

Cemetery

The town cemetery, which contains numerous historical gravesites, requires irrigation to ensure the aesthetics of the area.

Parks

The Ludwig Leichhardt Park is a potential area for upgrades to improve both the aesthetics and facilities of Taroom such as:

- Refurbishment of the War Memorial in the park
- Outdoor gym and exercise equipment adjacent to the skate park and pool

Footpaths

The installation and repair of walkways, including kerbing and channelling in the town, need to be considered.

Facilities

Upgrades to the town's facilities could be considered to improve the town's attraction to residents and visitors. Actions to be considered are:

- The beautification of the Central Business District
- Upgrades to the town refuse facilities such as anti-litter fencing
- Additional public seating
- Upgrade streets to curb-to-curb bitumen
- Ongoing development of the key sporting facilities including the Race Course, Golf Club and Show Grounds

Aerodrome


The future of the Taroom Aerodrome and Taroom Airstrip was raised by residents of Taroom. It has been expressed that both facilities are important to the socio- economic wellbeing of Taroom and District.

Men's Shed

The Men's shed needs a permanent location. Currently the very popular service is using a building at the showgrounds that belongs to another organisation.

Historical Projects

The Taroom Historical Society is undertaking a number of projects within the community especially the Historical Trail.



Infrastructure

Water

A resource that is of great importance to the area is water. The Nathan Dam project could be reconsidered for completion as the water this would bring to the surrounding areas would be of great assistance in ensuring future sustainability.

It is vital that the area's water supply and sewerage system is capable of providing for future development, as well as meeting applicable standards. In this regard, ensuring the proper use of water, including treated water, is important and steps towards this becoming an operational standard are worthwhile taking.

Roads

Roads are highly important to a rural town like Taroom. Both industry and individuals so their continued rely upon them maintenance and upgrade is highly important. A positive step for the area would be to ensure that a minimum standard of gravel roads in the area is developed. The extension of the bitumen road network, including maintaining and extending rural suppression and bitumen seals would be beneficial.

Other actions regarding roads in the area that would be worth undertaking are:

- Concreting of creek crossings such as Clamatis Creek, Currajong Road, Broadmere Road and Ghinghinda Road
- Alternative heavy vehicle routes such as Sawpit Lane
- Enhancement of existing heavy vehicle parking adjacent to Dawson Street
- Improvement of the traffic island/intersection at Wolsey/Yaldwyn Streets
- Upgrade of the intersection at Cracow Rd/Wandoan Road to divert trucks accessing the industrial area away from the School
- Provision of name signage of all major river, creek and water crossings

Upgrade of line marking within the town

The Fitzroy Development Road has been identified by the community as a key transport corridor It requires upgrades and improvements.

Rural Futures

The economy of Taroom and the surrounding area is based on agriculture, particularly grazing. It is imperative that steps are taken to ensure the future of the industry and the town.


A variety of actions are required:

- Identification of strategic cropping land
- · Protection of grazing land
- Ensure the availability of residential and industrial land
- Evaluation of lease changes regarding grazing in forestry country
- Support of rural and agricultural research and development
- Maintain the operation of the local clearing dip
- Addition of a weighbridge at the Cattle Yard

Resource Industry Strategy

The community would like a Resource Development Strategy developed for Taroom. As an existing community that is servicing the rural sector, any resource industry development will change the community dramatically. Areas to be considered need to include:

- Construction Camps are constructed on site in areas that will leave lasting benefit, e.g. Show Grounds or the Race Course
- Ideally no Single Persons Quarters
- 1, 2, & 3 bedroom permanent accommodation units constructed in the community to ensure operational employees have the opportunity to be part of community life.
- The community needs to be well informed by industry and government to take advantage of these opportunities



Government Services

To make sure Taroom continues to be a vibrant, growing community, the quality and availability of various government services needs to be ensured. In particular:

- Health services
- Police services
- Education

Media Services

The delivery of local media is in need of evaluation as much of what is received in Taroom is different from the rest of the Banana Shire. For example, the Taroom area receives ABC Radio broadcasts from Roma, Longreach and Toowoomba while the rest of the Banana Shire's broadcasts come from Capricornia.

It is critical for the ABC to create a half hour news service that will cover disasters and be broadcast simultaneously on Capricornia, Longreach, Roma & Southern Qld. This difference in coverage is a major issue that needs to be addressed.

Employment

Employment is of great concern to the area, as without suitable employment the town is unable to grow or even retain residents. Therefore, it is important to consider employment opportunities.

The creation of traineeships and apprenticeships, especially for the youth, would be very beneficial to the area.
