

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

This time of year is always an exciting one with all of the shows taking place around the Shire.

Local shows bring communities together and are a wonderful way for friends and family to catch up and take a break from their busy lives to enjoy what the shows have to offer.

Since the last issue we experienced a significant rain event in the aftermath of Ex Tropical Cyclone Debbie.

I personally visited a number of properties to ascertain the level of damage sustained as a result of this weather event.

As a Shire we fared reasonably well as opposed to other areas in the State which weren't so lucky.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind residents that after severe weather events they should report damage to Council as a priority so that damage can be logged.

The wellbeing of our Shire is always important but never more so than after a disaster or severe weather event.

If you believe that you, or someone you know, requires help or support, please contact Council so that we can put you in contact with a number of support services available in the region.

In early May, Deputy Mayor Cr Warren Middleton and I went to Mackay for a three day Local Government Association of Queensland Disaster Management Conference.

It was good timing after Cyclone Debbie's



devastation only a month earlier.

Whilst Banana Shire did sustain road and property damage, the Mackay, Whitsunday and Isaac communities were in the cyclone's path and endured huge destruction left in her wake.

It was worthwhile being with over 30 other councils and all emergency services personnel working out the best ways to deal with all types of disasters.

The Budget process is underway and it will be presented to Council at its June meeting for adoption.

Lake Callide Retreat will be launched early winter and we are looking forward to this tourism destination being open to the public.

Banana Shire Council is hosting the 16th Annual Industry Summit on August 8 with the theme 'Sustainable Farming – An Economic Driver'.

A breakfast will be held at 7am and the Summit will follow afterwards.

Both the breakfast and Summit are open to the public and I would encourage members of the community to come along.

- Moura, Coal 'N' Cattle Hotel, 6pm, Thursday, June 15


The events will be open to adults only and offer free finger food and drinks for purchase. Craig's books will be on sale for \$25 (cash only please).

Approved animal inspection

program ongoing

Council's approved animal inspection program started on March 1 and will continue until August 31 this year.

Council Officers are visiting properties throughout the Shire to ensure compliance with dog registration, identification and permit conditions.

This program will continue to include compliance with local laws for the keeping of animals and swimming pool requirements.

The approved inspection program allows Council's authorised officers to enter your yard to conduct an inspection for the above issues between the hours of 8am and 6pm.

One Million Stars to End Violence project half way to target

Many Banana Shire residents have been busy in the past few months supporting our commitment to weave 10,000 stars for the One Million Stars to End Violence project.

The May count of 5000 was reached thanks to some great attendance at school holiday workshops, networking mornings, school visits and even a 'Wine and Weaving' night at the Banana Shire Regional Arts Gallery.

Students from Redeemer Lutheran College and Moura and Biloela state high schools were instrumental in weaving quite a number of stars during lunchtime workshops.

Most of the students weaved with ease and it was encouraging to witness the conversations about the aim of the project and why we all need to talk openly about violence and the profound impact it has on the whole community.

Participants were excited their own stars would be be installed at the Gold Coast Commonwealth Games in 2018, with a few students doing some unique artwork on their finished products to make them stand out.

Stars can be made from any medium, including ribbon, newspaper and recycled junk mail.

Weaved stars can be dropped off at collection points including Banana Shire Support Centre, Council libraries or the Regional Art Gallery in Biloela.

An astronomical tour across the Shire

The Townsville Astronomy Group and Full Throttle Theatre are teaming up to bring what is believed to be a 'world-first tour' this winter.

The new production 'Astronomical' not only delivers belly laughs as it explores the universe, but allows the audience to participate by looking at the various astronomical wonders through large computer controlled telescopes.

It's a show suitable for all ages between 6 and 96.

A magical cast, including Gallileo, Einstein, Neil Armstrong and Stephen Hawking, leads the audience through space with nuggets of science intermixed with historical twists and turns from the characters' perspectives.

For example, Neil Armstrong explains how he got to the moon: "They put 2000 tonnes of rocket fuel in the rear end of a Saturn V rocket and lit it."

Astrology is debunked in an amusing way with Madam Charlatan tracing out your star signs in the sky and offering pseudoreadings.

Even the music is different: the sound effects are the eerie radio signals picked up from Saturn and other planets by passing deep space probes.

The play is an outdoor production with a dark sky background and the planets beckoning.

Please bring your own chairs, blankets and picnic dinner. There is a limit of 90 people for each show to allow everyone to get a good look through the six large computer controlled telescopes.

Tickets are \$50 for a family, \$20 for adults, \$10 for children under 12, while prep age and under are free.

Taroom

The Taroom community is excited about the expansion of its library facilities now underway. The larger space will provide more room for activities and staff will be able to encourage more local kindergarten and school groups to visit.

Moura

Minor renovation work has also been carried out at the Moura library. The library is being well patronised with membership increasing significantly in the past six months. Story Time has recommenced every Friday morning.

Theodore

Theodore's library continues to service the community on Thursday afternoons and Saturday mornings. Staff rotate stock with other Banana Shire libraries regularly to meet community needs.

Mobile

The mobile library is a welcome sight in our smaller communities throughout the Shire. Staff are able to build great rapport with community members on their visits. It is a smaller, less rushed environment and the community receives individualised attention.

Biloela

The Biloela library underwent renovations in May, so we now have a new front counter that is functional and aesthetically pleasing to the eye. While the library was closed, to allow workmen access and for power to be disconnected, the staff began a stocktake. This has been a huge effort, both mentally and physically, and will allow staff to better track our resources. We will also be able to cull old/damaged/unused resources and, once all the data is processed, identify gaps in our collection.

Dog breeder registration

commences

The State Government is introducing new laws to promote responsible dog breeding.

The legislation will be effective from May 26, 2017 and applies only to dogs born on or after this date.

The laws require all persons giving away, supplying, selling or advertising dogs or puppies to have a Supply Number that identifies the registered breeder of that dog.

The aim of the new laws is to protect the welfare of puppies and dogs sold in Queensland.

There are exemptions for primary producers who only supply working dogs to other primary producers.

Flood study floodplain

management plan open to feedback

Banana Shire Council commissioned Kellogg Brown & Root in 2014 to undertake a series of flood studies, develop coherent flood mitigation strategies and develop a Floodplain Management Plan (FPMP).

The FPMP is an indirect response to 'Recommendation 2', found in the Inspector-General Emergency Management Review of Cyclone and Storm Tide Sheltering Arrangements Report 3: 2014-15, following Cyclone Marcia in 2015, as well as previous flood events dating back to 2010.

The FPMP recommended and prioritised a series of actions to reduce the adverse impacts of flooding and to extend flood warning and evacuation time.

For the purposes of floodplain management in the Council area, the FPMP recommended a range of land use planning, development control, community awareness, community consultation, disaster planning and preparation activities.

It also recommended liaison with other levels and agencies of government, and a series of structural measures intended to change the way flood water behaves.

Arriving at a final accepted plan is an ongoing process and will require input from Council at a technical and operational works level, from councillors and political advisors, key stakeholders, and importantly from communities within the Banana Shire.

The Banana Shire Floodplain Management Plan, Structural Measures Report, Flood Mitigation Impact Maps, and Town Flood Study Animations can be accessed at www.banana.qld.gov. au/flood-study and are open for public comment until July 31, prior to final Council approval.

Inaugural Dog'sDay Out

Banana Shire residents and their pets turned out in large numbers to support our first Dog's Day Out event on April 23.

There were pooch-friendly activities, free microchipping, opportunities to try out the dog high jump equipment, and face painting to entertain the masses.

Attendees could also meet our Local Laws Officers and check out their animal control vehicles and equipment, and visit a Council display about animal management matters.

Veterinarians from Biloela Vet Clinic kindly donated their time to service the free microchipping and the Koolie Rescue Group displayed the great work they do in rescuing animals from shelters.

We even had some of the dogs that had been given the opportunity for a great new life with their adoptive families drop by to join us on the day.

The community's support and feedback was appreciated and Council hopes to make it a regular event that gets bigger and better.

Applying for Community Grants

Banana Shire Council Community Grants are available to all non-party political, local, community, cultural, religious, charitable, service, recreational or sporting community organisations primarily in the Banana Shire.

Application forms, policy and procedures are available on our website www.banana. qld.gov.au

Round closing dates

- February 28
- May 31
- August 31
- November 30

When planning events, please be mindful that funds can take up to four weeks to be released to successful applicants after each round closes.

How much can we apply for?

Projects - \$5000 maximum including 'inkind' costs.

Events - \$5000 maximum including 'inkind' costs. Subsequent events will be deemed as recurrent with a maximum financial and/or in-kind assistance contribution of \$1500 per year thereafter.

FAQs and common misconceptions

Q. What does in-kind assistance mean?

A. In-kind assistance is 'assisted use of Council's organisational resources where there is a cost to Council that is not transferred to the applicant'. These may include (but are not limited to):

- Labour
- Assisted use of Council equipment
- Earthworks, signage, lawn and garden maintenance
- Erection of marquees, street banners etc.

Q. Can we apply for money to be used as prize money or sponsorship?

A. No, these requests will not generally be considered. They will only be considered if the applicant is a Banana Shire show society, where a maximum per financial year contribution of \$100 for prize money for photo competitions and \$100 for trophies can be applied for.

Q. We really need the funds which we have requested on our application. Can we be assured we will be successful in obtaining the funds?

A. The level of assistance available through the program is limited by Council's budget decision and its priorities. No applicant can be guaranteed funding nor can any applicant be guaranteed to receive the full amount requested.

Q. We have some funds left over from what we originally applied for. Can we spend it on something else?

A. If you have extra funds left over from the original use of funds on your application, you will need to contact the Community Development Advisor before investing in something that is not listed on your application. It will need to be approved by Council processes before excess funds can be spent. If this is not adhered to, funds may have to be returned to Council.

Q. Do we need to make an appointment to discuss our application with the Councils' Community Development representative before we can submit an application?

A. Applicants are encouraged to contact relevant representatives of the Corporate and Community Services Department to discuss their proposed application, although it is not a necessary requirement of submitting their application.

Overcoming common errors:

- Ensure the form is fully complete:
 A checklist on the front of the
 application is a great guide to follow.
 Many checklists have been ticked
 without actually being completed.
 Please remember this could affect
 the outcome of your application.
 Consider asking a second person to
 check everything is complete.
- Make the project brief clear: Please read and complete this section carefully. Answers like 'same as last year' or 'sponsorship' will not be accepted.
